



CSVS BENOIT CARTIER MEDICAL STUDENT TRAVEL GRANT GUIDELINES

The CSVS Benoit Cartier medical student travel grants will be allocated and approved by the CSVS Executive prior to each meeting. ***Six (6) Canada wide travel grants up to \$750 each will be allocated to 1st and 2nd year medical students attending the CSVS Annual Meeting.*** A lottery system will be employed if more than one applicant from the same region applies. Consideration will be given to those who are giving a presentation/abstract. The funds will only be distributed if all requirements are met.

Medical Student Travel Grant Application

Medical Student Travel grants will be made available for travel and expenses incurred while attending the CSVS Annual Meeting. Travel funding is available to medical students interested in vascular surgery and attending an accredited medical school in Canada. The maximum amount of travel assistance is \$750.00. The medical student will be required to save all original travel receipts, boarding passes and hotel bills and submit them to the CSVS.

The deadline for submitting travel assistance applications is July 1st, 2019. Travel grant applications received after the deadline will not be approved.

Requirements for applicants:

- 1) Medical students must be enrolled in 1st or 2nd year at an accredited Canadian medical school.
- 2) Medical students must complete a Travel Grant Application form that includes signature from their Director of Student Affairs (in order to verify enrolment in an accredited training program)
- 3) Medical students must be registered for the CSVS Annual Meeting.

*Travel grants are not available for any other meetings or conferences. The deadline for sending in receipts for reimbursement is October 30th. Contact the CSVS with any question about eligibility. The awarding of this grant remains at the discretion of the CSVS Executive.

**The above guidelines are dependent on the financial position of the society. Travel grants may be cancelled at any time if finances do not allow disbursement of these travel grants.
